

## 2008 Corridor Recovery

### TEAM LEAD INSTRUCTIONS

#### § Responsibilities regarding Owner of the Residence:

1. Contact and meet with the owner to obtain his/her signature on the waiver (with you as a witness).
2. Ensure the gas and power are shut off and the residence has a green mark to signify it is safe to enter.
3. Discuss with the owner of the residence what needs to be done to ensure the team has the appropriate supplies and expectations are understood.

#### § Responsibilities regarding your Team and the Community effort:

1. Submit **Signed Waiver** to organization or agency designated recipient.
2. Share information from this meeting and packet with your team.
3. Attend training provided by United Way or other approved training and share this information with your Team.
4. Coordinate logistics for team deployment:
  - a. Determine where team will meet and deploy from. This may be dictated by organization supply distribution.
  - b. Distribute Orange T-shirts. Everyone is required to wear these during clean-up efforts.
  - c. Provide team assignments when at volunteer site.
  - d. Determine logistics for team travel to volunteer site.
5. Record who attends and how many hours each person works and provide record time to designated recipient.

## Waste Disposal Process and Guidelines

### **For customers who are in the original flood evacuated areas:**

The City will begin collection in the flood evacuation area as the flood waters recede. Residents INSIDE the original flood evacuated areas with damaged items are asked to set all of their damaged items AND regular garbage out for collection *at the curb*. DO NOT put collection items in the alley, even if this is your normal collection location. Inside the original flood evacuated areas items must be separated into the following separate piles:

1. Garbage (including mattresses and furniture)
2. Hazardous waste (paints, solvents, cleaning solvents, herbicides, etc.)
3. Appliances, TV's, computer monitors, tires
4. Wood Debris (including press board)
5. Scrap metal

All water or flood damaged *carpet and padding* should be bundled into 3 foot long by 2 foot in diameter rolls for collection.

*The \$1.25 sticker will be temporarily waived for this waste.* The sticker will not be waived for residents without these damages.

\*The City has requested 800 roll off boxes, 150 roll off truck operators, 60 semi-trailer transfer trucks, 12 front end and 12 skid loaders to assist with the most seriously affected flood areas from the Emergency management agency.

### **For customers who are not in the original flood evacuated areas:**

The Cedar Rapids Solid Waste and Recycling Division will continue garbage, recycling and yard waste operation as normal. Place items at your normal collection point on your normal collection day.

If you have suffered losses due to water, flood related damages, and /or sump pump backup divide items into the following separate piles and place them at your normal collection point on your normal collection day. *The \$1.25 sticker will be temporarily waived for this waste.* The sticker will not be waived for residents without these damages.

1. Garbage (including mattresses and furniture)
2. Hazardous waste (paints, solvents, cleaning solvents, herbicides, etc.)
3. Appliances, TV's, computer monitors, tires
4. Wood Debris (including press board)
5. Scrap metal

All water or flood damaged *carpet and padding* should be bundled into 3 foot long by 2 foot in diameter rolls for collection.
